


Joinery Details


Careful joinery adds to the strength of this Arts-and Crafts table without compromising its delicate lines.




Apron to leg Two small tenons connected by a stub tenon provide nearly the same glue-surface area and resistance to twisting as a full-width tenon, without weakening the leg as much



Lower drawer rail to leg Two small, parallel tenons effectively double the glue-surface area that would be available on a single tenon on this delicate frame member.

Shelf-to-shelf support rail The bottom tongue of the shelf's edge nests in the groove of the rail, providing a positive yet inconspicuous connection. The shelf

can expand and contract freely with changes in humidity.
